The shelter is a super busy place! There is so much talk about the '31 Beagles' who will arrive the night of August 22 (as you read this they will be here). There has not been much discussion about the cat population at the Northwoods Humane Society Shelter. Trust me, that side of the building is equally busy and full. The intake of adults and kittens is a daily event and fortunately we have not seen 31 at one time. Assistant Shelter Manager Lisa Lew and staff member Angie Larsen are caring for approximately 65 cats and kittens and working with those in foster homes. Lisa is hoping to put together another Purple Cat Van clinic (free spay and neuter) with Dr. Rupel at the shelter this fall, but currently we do not have a date.

Besides the incoming beagles, we also have an assortment of dogs waiting for their forever homes. Two are tiny terrier mixes that came from a hoarding rescue. These little ones are very needy. They each need to go into a home with a lot of patience, time and love. They need to learn trust, socialization, housetraining and the belief that they will be safe. The 'beagle' schedule is the following: August 22 – late or August 23 early – the beagles arrive August 23 and 24 – days of rest and acclimation to surroundings and new people. August 25 – Intake day – vaccinations, blood draws, microchips, baths, grooming as needed, medical assessments, temperament assessments. Fecal checks will be done over the three days for each dog. August 26 – a day of rest for the dogs and finish up any remaining intake needs. August 27 – Foster families are scheduled to pick up their fosters. August 28 – a day of rest and deep breathing by the staff and volunteers and continued care of all the remaining dogs still waiting for homes.

August is "Buy A Supply" Month For the Northwoods Humane Society. Please consider buying paper towels, bleach, canned dog or cat food, or kitty litter. Board members Linda Graham and Lori Butala have made arrangements with Coburn's MarketPlace and Hayward Feed and Seed to create display areas showing the needed items. Shoppers may purchase these items and leave them at the store and Lori and Linda will pick them up and bring them to the shelter. MarketPlace always has a food shelf by the checkout counters for NHS. We thank Marketplace and Hayward Feed and Seed for their continuing support.

Our recycling can collectors have a request: Aluminum Cans Only. The drop off sites are at the business Somewhere Else on Highway 27 South, at the NHS Thrift Shop near 3<sup>rd</sup> Street and Dakota across the City Fire Hall, and at the NHS Shelter.

The Thrift Shop continues to be a hub of energy and giving. The shop is totally run by volunteers and is open 7 days a week – 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. The shop is located on Third Street in Hayward.
